When I was growing up, the Lutheran church down the street held a Vacation Bible School every summer. It was an adventure for me—mom walking me there at 9 a.m. and picking me up at noon, singing unfamiliar songs, exploring rooms and hallways that were new to me, creating mosaics of Jesus' name out of colored macaroni. And there were tons of moms helping – a couple doing registration, some leading crafts, different ones teaching the music. I can't say that I remember anything I learned about religion or faith at VBS, but it was a wholesome diversion that got me out of the house one hot week every summer.

My own experience of VBS has been on my mind as we re-think our summer programming this year. For quite some time, Union has collaborated with the other UCC churches in Brown County to offer a combined VBS, yet for several years, no Union children have participated. Nonetheless, we helped put it on in a gesture of collaboration.

But when the other churches also didn't have children register for VBS this summer, we knew something needed to change. After talking with potential participants and volunteers alike, we learned that timing was significant. For a few households, the week we scheduled simply didn't work for them, but for many more, a half-day for one week program just didn't fit into their summer schedules. More and more parents are working all summer, and many of those who aren't working are doing so because they need a break. That shapes the availability of children, too, as more and more children are in daycare or other all summer long programs.

Enter: Faith Family Fieldtrips (see page 4 for more information)

The idea is to provide a fun, faith-filled time for fellowship and learning at a time that works for a breadth of households. And just because these FFF are replacing VBS, don't think they're just for kids! Everyone is invited to come together to eat, and think, and pray, and play.

This inaugural year, we've taken on a nature theme – celebrating God's gifts of earth, water, and fire! On the third Thursday of every month this summer, we will gather in a different location for a simple meal and faith formation, followed by FUN.



Moon Beach Retreat is a weekend of fun, fellowship and reflection. It is a great place to share worship opportunities, discussion and camaraderie, with new and old friends of all ages.


Moon Beach Camp is in St. Germain just west of Eagle River and is part of the Outdoor Ministry program of the United Church of Christ. It sits on the shores of Moon Lake and Little Saint Germain Lake. The cabins overlook Moon Lake and have been redone so each is furnished, heated and has a bathroom with a shower. There is a large beautiful lodge, and the camp is fully staffed with wonderful, helpful people. The camp offers the peaceful quiet of northern Wisconsin among pine, oak and birch trees.

Friday, after arriving and getting settled, there will be snacks and fellowship time around the fireplace in the lodge. We are treated to three delicious meals on Saturday prepared by the camp and then a fabulous brunch Sunday morning. Saturday, after breakfast, adults are invited to meet with our leader/facilitator in the lodge (topic and leader to be determined). Children will have their own separate program. The afternoon and evening are up to you. There will be some activities and sometimes a short service project for benefit of the camp. There is a beautiful beach with a variety of watercraft, hiking trails and beautiful places to just sit, read and reflect. The evening is game time highlighted by ice cream sundaes and a bonfire.

Sunday morning is check out. We pack up, enjoy brunch, have an informal worship service by the fireplace, clean up the cabins, and are usually on our way home around 11 o'clock.

The cost for the retreat is \$140 per adult and \$25 per child. Financial aid is available (talk to Pastor Bridget). More information and signup sheets will be forthcoming.

Martha (her name has been changed) is a member of the family. At least it feels that way. She has been in one of our transitional living homes for over a year and is making significant progress. Martha shared her personal journey at our annual celebration and recognition dinner on May 1.

"I was in a very abusive relationship and felt very broken down inside to the point that I believed I could not or would not ever be anything in life. The Salvation Army (TSA) and Ecumenical Partnership for Housing (EPH) came along and gave me strength, hope and inspiration to prove to myself and anyone who didn't believe in me, wrong. You (EPH and TSA) gave me the chance to spend time with my girls like a family and set goals and healthy boundaries. Through your support, and my case manager, Kim, I was given the chance to heal from my domestic abuse and become a stronger woman, and mother. I am truly grateful to EPH and TSA for everything you have done to help me and my girls. Thank you, and God bless you all."

Also recognized at the dinner was The Salvation Army Transitional Housing team, celebrating 25 years in partnership. Terry and Chris Hasselbacher were awarded the Duane Howell Service award, which is given to volunteers who have a history of service and living the EPH values. Terry and Chris coordinate the pick-up of furniture, they track our inventory, and help place it in our homes.

Thank you, partnership churches, for providing safety and stability for the families we serve. You are making a difference, one family at a time.



Progress Report from the Search Committee

The Search Committee for the Minister of Faith Formation and Community Engagement position is now at the interview stage of the process. We are screening candidates through close review of the Ministerial Profiles they provide. As we prepare for each interview, we draw on state and national UCC resources, and our own Local Church Profile. We pray together, mindful that we are seeking God's guidance in this process of discernment.

We conduct our initial interviews via Skype, exploring each candidate's strengths and call to ministry. During the interviews, the conversations begin with our team's prepared questions, which then lead into a more informal dialogue about this innovative two-fold position. We are a diverse committee in our experience in Union's life as a faith community, and depend on each other's knowledge as we respond to a candidate's questions.
