

Living in Grace, Giving with Gratitude

One of the things that I emphasize when preparing parents for the baptism of their child is the idea of grace: that there is absolutely nothing that we do to earn God's love, that God loves us wholly and completely not because of our good behavior, not because we support the right causes, not because we say the right things, but simply because we exist.

It's heady, really, to imagine a love so pure that it is not dependant, but rather wholly and completely a gift. When we celebrate the baptism of an infant, we immerse ourselves in the world-shaping concept of unearned grace. This grace then becomes the foundation for a baptismal life, a life that will be nourished by the Body of Christ manifest as the church, a life that will be welcome no matter how far it strays. Thus, the baptismal concepts of belonging, repentance, and conversion are still very real, but we first acknowledge that God's grace is the foundation, God's grace is what makes those other facets possible.

This fall our annual pledge drive theme is "Living in Grace, Giving with Gratitude." As in baptism, we start with grace. The blessing of God's abundant love in our lives has brought many blessings. We have been graced (pun intended) in innumerable ways — our gifts of character, our resources, those we love and care about. I'd even say that things as ephemeral as our conscience and our ability to appreciate beauty are gifts from the Divine.

If baptism initiates us into God's grace, a baptismal life recognizes that we are swimming in a sea of grace.

"Giving with Gratitude," then, is our response to the wonder which is God's gracious love. We have been blessed to be a blessing. God has given to us so generously, and the natural response is to pass on that generosity. Using God as our model, we give with grace out of love.

Over the course of this month, you will hear testimonies in worship about how your fellow Union members have encountered God's grace through our church. In doing so, we will celebrate the stories of the impact God makes through Union.

As you prayerfully consider your pledge for 2018, it may be interesting to take on this spiritual exercise designed to help you reflect on God's grace in your life and the practice of generosity: Set aside two periods of time. In the first, take some time to make a list of all of the ways you've been blessed. Think creatively, taking a solid chunk of time to reflect on that for which you are grateful. Offer prayers of thanksgiving. In the second prayer time, after you've prayed in gratitude for all of the ways you've been blessed, ask yourself how you are being a blessing. How are you using your blessings to give glory to God? Jot down some ideas of how you can use what you've been given to invest in the lives of others, to further God's reign of love. This may include ideas for investing financial resources, or it may include ways to invest your time, energy, and passion.

No matter how you are called to express your gratitude, I urge you to steep yourself in God's abundant grace this fall. We'll all be better for it!


Thanksgiving Service at Congregation Cnesses Israel 222 S. Baird Street
