Dear Union Friends,

Recently, a friend relayed this story: She received a package in the mail from her sister. It wasn't her birthday, was months before the holidays. My friend had been having a particularly trying week at work, and her sister's surprise gift of a sweet smelling candle, some soothing lotion, and a couple of snapshots from their teen years were a balm for her aching spirit.

She texted her sister a heartfelt message, "Thank you for your thoughtful package. In the midst of a dark week, you were a ray of sunshine!"

Her sister responded, "Oh, it was just some stuff I'd been meaning to get to you for a while."

My friend says that the joy and comfort that she had felt about being remembered and supported dissipated with her sister's response. The giver, by diminishing the importance of the gift, diminished the receiver's joy.

To be fair, my guess is that the sister who sent the gift was trying to be modest. "It was no big deal." She didn't want to call attention to herself. She didn't send the gift for the purpose of praise or thanks. The difficulty is that our mothers were right all those years ago – it IS the intention that counts. When we deflect and diminish a thank you or a compliment we are in turn diminishing the intention.

Think about it. Have you ever received a bouquet of dandelions from a child? The sheer glee on the child's face is the true gift. Their intention is the true beauty.

So, too, in our social conventions of offering thanks and compliments. One of the wisdom figures of my seminary days was Dr. Judy Logue who wrote extensively on the dynamics of forgiveness and reconciliation. A grande dame from Baton Rouge, Judy was all poise and class. One day she pulled me aside. She had just complimented me about my work on a particularly involved assignment, and I had deflected out of modesty. "Let me tell you a secret," she said, "The kindest response to a compliment is 'Thank you!' and the classiest response to gratitude is 'You're welcome!'"

As we enter in to the season of Thanksgiving, I encourage you to be mindful of both sides of the equation - to be gracious both in the offering of




