

There's often a nostalgia that goes along with the holidays. Has there ever been a more iconic image of Thanksgiving than Norman Rockwell's "Freedom from Want"? Every year while I was growing up, my mother would painstakingly hang tinsel, one string at a time, on a scraggly looking live tree, despite the fact that both the tinsel and the tree made more of a mess than she could possible handle, because it reminded her of her father and the trees he would decorate. I even know a few self-proclaimed foodies who are willing to eat sweet potatoes with marshmallows once a year, simply because it wouldn't be Thanksgiving without them.

There's a curious aspect of our nature that wants to go back — to a different place and time, to something we knew and understood, to a place where everybody knows your name (sorry, that last phrase just flowed out of my fingers, unbidden).

Floating just below the surface of many holiday traditions is a longing to go back.

This notion captured my spirit a few weeks ago when I was on my annual Advent Planning Retreat. (You may not have thought about this before, but my spiritual preparation is usually roughly one season ahead of the church. Think of pastors and retailers in the same boat; our preparations need to be ahead of the crowd.) My colleagues and I were pondering some readings by some of the ancient Mothers of the church, in which this idea of Advent as a cosmic coming home was the common thread. Returning to the ever-loving arms of God. Returning to wholesomeness. Returning to our original, grace-filled existence. Returning to right priorities and good values. Even the earth agrees, and will soon be returning to a pattern of increasing rather than decreasing light.

In Advent, we make preparations for everything to get back to the way it should be, the way it once belonged. We make preparations to be able to get back to recognizing God in the vulnerability and fragility of a newborn.

Perhaps that was why I was so startled when I got home from my retreat, turned on the news, and saw the latest band of protesters screaming, "go home" and "go back to where you came from" to asylum seekers.

It felt so violent that this beautiful, spiritual yearning that many orient their whole year toward was at the same time being weaponized to tell one group of God's beloveds that they are unwelcome, less, unworthy.

We are all seeking, yearning, to get home, some literally, all theologically. It felt so incongruous to find such spiritual beauty and and such brokenness tied together in one phrase.

Friends, some of the earliest Biblical writings tell us that all people of God make up the one Body of Christ. They tell us that there is no Jew nor Greek (translate U.S. citizen or Mexican/Guatemalan/Salvadoran), that we are all one in Christ Jesus. They tell us that we need to be careful how we treat strangers, lest we realize those strangers are actually God's messengers.

With this in mind, I've decided that my Advent project this year will be to seek out strangers and outcasts and those who are far from home, whatever that home may be, and try to make here and now a little more like home for them. I don't know exactly how this will play out, but it is one small way that I hope to prepare the manger.




