Common Council JOSHUA Report - March/April

On October 2021 The Greater Green Bay Blueprint to Prevent and End Homelessness was released. The plan is designed to be action oriented, with proposed initial "small wins" focused on reducing harm, as well as medium to long-term actions and tasks that would transform systems and potentially change entirely how the city, county and local providers respond to people experiencing housing instability and homelessness. JOSHUA has two task forces working with the larger "Blueprint" effort.

End the Lockdown Panel at St.Norbert's Mulva Library
